#### General advice

#### If inhaled

Move to fresh air. If not breathing, give artificial respiration. If breathing is difficult, give oxygen. Get medical attention.

<b>In case of skin contact</b>	Wash off immediately with soap and plenty of water, removing all contaminated clothing and shoes. Get medical attention. If skin irritation persists, call a physician.
<b>In case of eye contact</b>	Flush eye with water for 15 minutes. Get medical attention.
<b>If swallowed</b>	Do not induce vomiting without medical advice. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Obtain medical attention.

Causes eye irritation. Eye contact may result in redness or pain. Causes skin irritation. Skin contact may result in redness, pain, inflammation, itching, scaling. May cause irritation of respiratory tract.

Treat symptomatically. First-Aid Providers: Avoid exposure to blood or body fluids. Wear gloves and other necessary protective clothing. Dispose of contaminated clothing and equipment as bio-hazardous waste.
