### 4.1 Description of first-aid measures

## General advice

<b>If inhaled</b>	If breathing is irregular or stopped, immediately seek medical assistance and start first aid actions. Provide fresh air.
<b>In case of skin contact</b>	Wash with plenty of soap and water.
<b>In case of eye contact</b>	Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do. Continue rinsing. Irrigate copiously with clean, fresh water for at least 10 minutes, holding the eyelids apart.
<b>If swallowed</b>	Rinse mouth with water (only if the person is conscious). Do NOT induce vomiting.

Do not leave affected person unattended. Remove victim out of the danger area. Keep affected person warm, still, and covered. Take off immediately all contaminated clothing. In all cases of doubt, or when symptoms persist, seek medical advice. In case of unconsciousness place person in the recovery position. Never give anything by mouth.

### 5.2 Specific hazards arising from the substance or mixture

In case of insufficient ventilation and/or in use, may form flammable/explosive vapor-air mixture. Solvent vapors are heavier than air and may spread along floors. Places which are not ventilated, e.g. unventilated below ground level areas such as trenches, conduits and shafts, are particularly prone to the presence of flammable substances or mixtures. **7.1 Precautions for safe handling**

**Precautions on safe handling**

Use local and general ventilation. Avoidance of ignition sources. Keep away from sources of ignition. No smoking. Take precautionary measures against static discharge. Use only in well-ventilated areas. Due to danger of explosion, prevent leakage of vapours into cellars and ditches. Ground/bond container and receiving equipment. Use explosion-proof electrical/ventilating/lighting equipment. Use only non-sparking tools. Places which are not ventilated, e.g. unventilated below ground level areas such as trenches, conduits and shafts, are particularly prone to the presence of flammable substances or mixtures. Vapors are heavier than air, spread along floors and form explosive mixtures with air. Vapors may form explosive mixtures with air.

### Hygiene measures

Wash hands after use. Do not eat, drink, or smoke in work areas. Remove contaminated clothing and protective equipment before entering eating areas. Never keep food or drink in the vicinity of chemicals. Never place chemicals in containers that are normally used for food or drink. Keep away from food, drink, and animal feedings.
